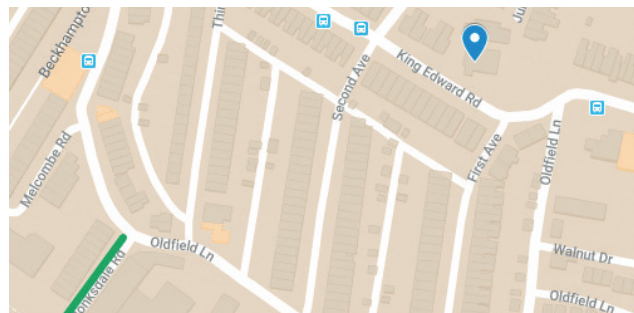

The South West Gospel Partnership (SWGP) Ministry Training Course is a one-day-a-week course for those who want to understand the Bible better and be equipped to teach it to others. We recognise the vital need in today's church to equip all believers for works of ministry and to develop the next generation of Bible teachers who will faithfully pass on the Word of God.

The course runs every Thursday, from 9.25am to 3.30pm at St. Bartholomew's Church, Bath for 3 ten week terms and costs £215 per term. The next course begins September 2022. There is an optional second year which builds on what is learnt in the first year.

WHO IS IT FOR?

The SWGP Ministry Training Course is for any Christian who has a desire to grow in their faith and be equipped to pass on the Bible's message to others. We have a wonderful variety of people on the course, ranging from gap-year students, working people, right through to those in retirement. It's ideal for anyone in ministry, whether as a trainee, apprentice or occasional preacher, if you're working with youth, children or students, whether leading a homegroup or involved in women's ministry. The course will teach you how to handle God's Word and pass it on to others.

The course is open to men and women with evangelical convictions who want to be trained to serve in ministry. Applicants will be expected to have the support of their home church.

WHAT IS COVERED?

Each week is divided into four main sessions (with an optional extra at the end of the day):

Bible Overview – looking at how God's Word fits together from Genesis to Revelation. We study a different biblical book each week and students are encouraged to prepare by reading through the book beforehand.

Expositions – in-depth study of 6 Bible books from different genres, showing how to teach and apply them in the 21st century. In 2021–22 we are focusing on Exodus, Judges, Job, John, Acts, and 1 & 2 Corinthians.

Gospel Ministry – practical training from a range of experienced pastors and Bible teachers. Subjects include Christian Leadership, Giving Talks, Personal Evangelism, Church Planting, Islam and Apologetics.

Workshops – a chance to gain experience in giving talks and leading Bible studies with feedback from ministers and preachers. After preparing passages in the first term, students practise giving talks or leading Bible studies in a group setting.

Hebrew (optional) – we learn Biblical Hebrew from scratch in an accessible and fun way, learning key words, basic grammar, memorising Bible verses and eventually reading through the book of Jonah.

We also have an optional **British Museum Trip**, seeing how archaeology supports the Bible and gives insight into the background of biblical events.



WHO TEACHES ON THE COURSE?



Charlie Ward is the Course Director. He studied at Oak Hill College before becoming Assistant Minister at St Bart's in Bath in 2006. He teaches Bible Overview, Church History, Hebrew and a range of other subjects on the course.
